About Us

The LTFRG is a not-for-profit organisation dedicated to the protection, restoration, and celebration of the Ludlow Tuart Forest and its cultural heritage. We work collaboratively with community members, government bodies, and environmental experts to ensure the forest's long-term sustainability and public appreciation. In parallel with this the LTFRG is restoring the heritage listed Ludlow Settlement as an eco-tourist destination and a window to the forest.

Role Purpose

Committee members play a vital role in guiding the strategic and tactical direction of LTFRG, supporting project development, and ensuring our initiatives reflect our environmental and heritage values. This is a hands-on governance role with opportunities to contribute meaningfully to restoration efforts, community outreach, and educational initiatives.

- Leading projects when and if required.
- Contribute to planning, grant applications, and community engagement
- Assist with reviewing documents and providing input on proposals and reports
- Support the coordination of events, volunteer activities, and restoration efforts
